

Aapo Säask was born in 1943 in Estonia and presently lives in Sweden.

Since 1973, Aapo Säask has developed proprietary technology in water treatment and sustainable energy which has resulted in formation of several private and public companies, which reflect different applications for the technologies developed.

One of the main areas of development is a novel water purification, re-use and desalination technology called 'Membrane Distillation' (MD). This development is carried out in co-operation with the Energy Department of the Royal Institute of Technology in Stockholm, Sweden (KTH) which is an internationally recognized promoter of polygeneration technology.

Background in environmental technologies:

Aapo Säask started to work on environmental issues in 1968. In that year, the Swedish Government pioneered to include "the human environment" on the agenda of the UN Economic and Social Council. This eventually led to the first UN Conference on the human environment which was held in Stockholm in 1972.

At that time Aapo Säask founded the research and investment company [Scarab Development AB](#). The objective was to find business solutions to environmental problems by developing innovative sustainable technologies and business structures. The main areas were poverty alleviation, sustainable energy, purification/desalination of water, commodity processing and health.
